

What is the difference between a reproduction, a forgery and a replica?

Reproduction

Any sort of copy of an original object which is not under copyright law. A graphic technique using the process of lithography.

Forgery

A forgery (false or fake) Forgery is the process of making or imitating objects with the intent to deceive.

Replica

A replica is a work that is relatively indistinguishable from the original. Replicas are often used for historical purposes, such as being placed in a museum. The replica of an original object can only be made by the artist (or the descendants on behalf of the artist) who made the original artwork.

Excerpt from the license agreement between VG Bild-Kunst, Bonn and Kunstmuseum Gehrke-Remund in Baden-Baden:

"a) the Museum obtains a simple, non transferable right **to replicate** the works of Frida Kahlo, as listed in the attachment, and to exhibit them in the museum to be viewed by the public".
